



HEALTHCARE BURNOUT SYMPOSIUM AND ALL IN: WELLBEING FIRST FOR HEALTHCARE ANNOUNCE NEW PARTNERSHIP TO END CLINICIAN BURNOUT AND PROMOTE WELLNESS

SAN FRANCISCO, CA –The [Healthcare Burnout Symposium](#) announces a new partnership collaboration with the [ALL IN: WellBeing First for Healthcare](#) initiative, a call to action for healthcare organizations to commit to the creation and cultivation of workplace cultures that prioritize health worker well-being.

The Healthcare Burnout Symposium will convene in person at the Hyatt Regency Embarcadero Hotel, San Francisco, January 24-26, 2022, to address clinician burnout as a public health emergency that requires immediate action. This mental health crisis has been fueled by the pandemic and has resulted in elevated levels of anxiety, depression, isolation, PTSD, and burnout for physicians, nurses, and many healthcare workers. This January, healthcare leaders from across the nation gather at this symposium to inspire a shift in focus from advocating for change within healthcare systems, to driving specific actions and strategies to end clinician burnout.

Keynote speaker J. Corey Feist, co-founder of the [Dr. Lorna Breen Heroes' Foundation](#), and leading change agent member of the “ALL IN” coalition, has rallied support to successfully pass federal legislation this December to support suicide prevention, reduce burnout, and improve mental health conditions among health care professionals. Feist says, “Our health care heroes have long experienced high levels of stress and burnout, but COVID-19 has only amplified the problem. Burnout has been shown to cause a 200% increase risk in medical errors, and 62% of nurses and 42% of doctors are feeling burned out while battling COVID-19.”

“Leading researchers will present at the Healthcare Burnout Symposium, including Tait Shanafelt, Christine Sinsky, Christina Maslach, Robert Pearl, among many other physicians and nurse leaders. We look forward to working together with our partners to gather in person to strategize and hear from direct experience about best practices that truly make a difference in daily work. Hospital systems must ensure a culture of wellness is systematically embedded to support the strength and future of public health”, says Bill Doherty, Conference Director, ICD events.
